II. **Task Force/Sub-Committee/Special Reports**

a. **Resources Committee** – A. Brown

- i. **Information:** Electrical Vehicle Charging Station Standard Operating Procedures – A. Brown/H. Agah
The District has existing electric vehicle charging stations (EVCS) installed by the colleges that are currently operating without a standardized or formally approved procedure. With the addition of 172 new EVCS delivered through the District Solar Project, a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) is required to establish consistent districtwide guidelines for EVCS use, fee structure, maintenance, operational oversight, compliance with state regulation, financial sustainability, safe and equitable access to EV charging, and enforcement across all campuses.

b. **Teaching and Learning Committee** – S. Rivera-Lacey

- i. **Information:** Mapping Articulated Pathways (MAP) and Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) Update – S. Rivera-Lacey/S. Lee
RCCD serving as a lead implementation partner in California's statewide expansion of Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) through the Mapping Articulated Pathways (MAP). Since 2017, this effort has grown from regional innovation to a scalable statewide infrastructure aligned with Vision 2030 and the California

Master Plan for Career Education. Supported by significant state investment, the initiative removes barriers to CPL, modernizes policies such as AP 4235, and ensures no-cost access for colleges and students. With 2025-26 goals of serving up to 70,000 students including more than 34,000 veterans already engaged - the work includes systemwide technical integration, common course crosswalks across disciplines, AI-assist tools to support academically validated skills and credentials, faculty partnerships, and extensive training and outreach. Together, these efforts advance equitable access, accelerate completion, and strengthen workforce pathways across California's community colleges.
